Anthony "Gabby" Camillo, 94, of Cortland died peacefully at his home after a brief illness on Thursday, August 2, 2012.

Born, November 23, 1917 in Cortland, Tony was the son of Daniel and Adele Lolli Camillo and was a resident of Cortland his entire life.

Tony was a communicant of St. Anthony of Padua Roman Catholic Church. He had retired from Brockway Motor Co. and prior to that was employed for many years at Wickwire's.
