



Mr. Guy Passeri

August 6, 1920 - October 11, 2014

Guy Passeri, 94, of Cortland, passed away October 11, 2014, at Cortland Regional Medical Center, Cortland, NY, after a long illness. Born August 6, 1920, in Ceccano, Italy, Guy was the only child of Giovannbattista "John" Passeri and Francesca D'Annibale Passeri. He immigrated to the United States in 1937 and became a naturalized American citizen in 1943.

Guy's 81 year career as a barber began at age 12 when he was apprenticed to become a barber in Rome, Italy. After arriving in Cortland, he was a student at St. Mary's High School and Cortland High School, working part-time at the barber shop of his future father-in-law, Nick D'Adamio and then starting his own barber shop on Clinton Avenue. A self-trained musician, Guy played guitar for the Round Up Riders with a weekly radio show in Ithaca in the late 1930's and played with the Cosimo Bros. Band in the early 1940's. During WWII, Guy served with the U.S. Army's 36th Division of the 5th Army and fought in North Africa, the Battles of Salerno, Anzio, and Cassino, and was also translator and driver, often going behind enemy lines as a liaison to the Italian partisans who were helping the Allies against Nazi Germany. Next, Guy was transferred to the 6th Army and fought in France and Germany. As a corporal, he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal in 1945.

After WWII, Guy finished his education through the G.I. Bill, graduating from Central High School in Syracuse and completing courses at Cortland

Business College. After marrying Yolanda D'Adamio in 1945, Guy continued barbering in Cortland, Sampson Air Force Base (Geneva), Truxton, and at Cornell University from the 1950's to the 1970's, when he started the Trojan Hair Stylist and King's Den Barber Shop in Cortland. When he reached retirement age, Guy sold the King's Den, but his love of barbering and being with the public inspired him to return to the shop he had founded where he continued barbering until September of 2013 at age 93. A very enterprising man who always had at least two jobs until his 60's, barbering was not Guy's only occupation. Guy also had a summer grocery store at DeRuyter Lake and Guy's Boat Company, for boat and motor sales, in the 1960's.

Always full of energy and zeal for life, Guy was a loving and involved father to his three daughters, a devoted grandfather and great grandfather, an active communicant at St. Anthony's Church, member of San Rocco Lodge, and clarinetist for the Old Timers Band from its days as the Civic Band, even playing first clarinet until just a few years ago. After the death of his first wife, he married Ann Bartolone in 1975 and enjoyed many trips with her to Hawaii, Italy, and various locations in the U.S.

Guy is pre-deceased by his two wives and survived by his daughters, Stephanie (Robert) Passeri-Densmore, Deborah (Jerry) Coye, and Adrienne (Michael) Bruno and grandchildren Brent(Helene), Greg, Seth (Linda), Noel, Cristina (Derek), Vanessa, Erica, Monica, and Michael, and seven great grandchildren. Guy is also survived by step-children Pat (Cathy) Bartolone, Tony(Tammy) Bartolone, and Betty (Al Stauber) Bartolone and step-grandchildren, Sebastian(Becky), Renae (Jeremy), Christine (Michael), and Tony (Nicole) and seven step great grandchildren. Also surviving are many cousins in Italy and Canada and close friends, JoeTucci and Angelo DiPietro of Cortland. All family members and friends will miss Guy's warmth, humor, and dedication.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated by Father Joe Zareski on Friday at 10 AM at St. Anthony's Church with a luncheon to follow internment at St. Mary's Cemetary.
