Mrs. Mary Jude Papalia Clarke was born on April 18th, 1959, to Dr. Anthony Papalia, and Ruth Wickersham Papalia in Altoona, PA. For the past 11 years she has been living with her beloved husband Milo ('Mi') Clarke in St. Augustine, FL. After Tony lost his wife Ruth in 2019, he was happy to move to Florida and live with Mi and his oldest daughter Mary J.

On Saturday, May 25, 2024, Mary J. passed away at the UF Health (Flagler Hospital) in St. Augustine. She is survived by her husband Mi, father Anthony, sisters Jean, Anne and Martha. Her daughter Naomi lives in the New York City area. She is predeceased by her mother Ruth W. Papalia; by her first husband Ralph C. DeHart, and her son Andrew C. DeHart. Mary's route to Florida came via Facebook when in 2012 she created an account which caught the eye of her old high school friend Mi Clarke. While Mary was in Wisconsin and Mi was in Florida a romance built on friendship and warmth blossomed. They married in 2012 and started a life in Florida together proving the best love can sometimes happen after a wait. They enjoyed many trips together, to Japan, Hawaii, Italy, France, Spain, Monaco, Mexico, Belize, Grand Caymans, Bahamas, Alaska, around the British Isles and Norway. 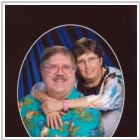
