



Mr. Ralph G. Race

July 6, 1930 - July 9, 2017

Ralph G. Race, 87, died at Cortland Regional Medical Center on July 9, 2017. He was the son of Harold and Carrie Lamb Race, and was born in Cortland on July 6, 1930. Ralph graduated from Cortland High School in 1949 and served on the USS Midway during the Korean War. While on the Midway he was baptized Catholic off La Spezia, Italy and was confirmed by the Spanish Archbishop on Palma de Mallorca. He and his beloved wife, Margaret Neugebauer were married at St. Mary's Church on August 9, 1952.

Ralph was a journeyman electrician with the IBEW 43 for 68 years and served as business agent in Cortland for 10 years before they joined Syracuse. Ralph was also a member and past President of the Emerald Hose Co. and life member of the Cortland Fire Department. He was an usher for 50 years at St. Mary's Church.

Ralph enjoyed cutting his sons' and friends' hair, hunting, playing chess, and was an avid racquetball player until he was 75. In the summer, he enjoyed swimming a mile everyday after work in Tully Lake. He always enjoyed when the family got together for birthdays and holidays.

He is survived by his wife of 64 years and 11 months Margaret, his sister Marina (Lawrence) Twomey and his children Mary Lee Durant, Richard (Patricia) Race, Robert (Colleen) Race, Charles (Ann) Race, Nancy (Charles)

Dalley, Carla (Michael) Shanahan, Kathleen (David) Lee, John (Kristen) Race. “ I was born in England. My Mother was blind and deaf, my Father was deaf and we were dirt poor. When my sister Marina was ten she was sent to New York to be adopted by Ralph's parents, Harold and Carrie. Carrie was my Father's half sister. A year later, at age seven. I was sent to be adopted by my Father's half brother, John and his wife Mary. Marina and I crossed the Atlantic, not on an airliner but on the Queen Elizabeth ocean liner. John and Mary owned a bakery and had busy lives. Summers they sent me to spend a few weeks with Ralph and Peggy. I felt so loved there. The first summer, I was about ten. Peggy was nursing her first baby. I asked her, "Does one side give white milk and the other chocolate?" In 1965 my my birth parents came to visit for the first time and they stayed at Ralph and Peggy's cottage on Tully Lake. I taught everyone how to talk to my blind and deaf Mother on her hand. Many years ago Ralph said that the English are screwy. They drive on the wrong side of the road. I said no, they drive on the left side. Then I learned why. In the olden days, when Knights on horseback walked down the road, if they were on the right side they would have to swing their lance across to the left. On the left side they could easily knock the other guy off his horse. In the US Air Force, 1965 to 1969, I was trained and then taught the electrical trade. In the late eighties I started a small manufacturing company. The entire building needed an upgrade to it's electrical service. Ralph had just retired. I flew Ralph and Peggy out and put them up at our cabin at Mount Hood. For the better part of a week Ralph and I re-wired the entire building. Even Peggy helped. When Marina told me that Ralph had passed away I sobbed. I'm sorry that I couldn't be there for the funeral. Ralph, for me, was a man from whom I could learn how to be a man.
